The indicator is an object of subtle movement, sometimes a slight hesitation is all. It also has different functions. The styles of indicators cover everything from steelhead fishing to still waters. There are many different styles on the market, and some are made by anglers. Perhaps this would be a good subject for a program.

Speaking of programs, the April membership meeting program will be on guided trips. Not many of us have had the opportunity to go on a guided trip, but if you are on the Alaska trip of a lifetime or want to learn how to fish a certain spring creek or lake this will be an interesting program.



Owyhee Cleanup



In a snow storm, beer is good!!!!


Notice the back of his jacket and guy on ladder in background. Fishing poor because of storm and

P.S. A close look at one of the pictures of the browns shows the prince nymph in its mouth.








Al Followed the Fish Truck


