Jeff Dillion (IDFG) completed the application for a grant from The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, Wildlife and Sport Fish Restoration Program and received \$90682 in grant funds to construct the 1.3 acre pond. 3. October 17,2009 was the grand opening of Weiser Community Pond. 4. Mayor John Walker with the help of Jeff Dillion tagged and stocked the first rainbow trout. 5. From the first stocking of fish thru April 2018 35838 trout have been stocked in the pond as well as some Bluegill. Largemouth Bass and Catfish.



April in the Scablands of Washington



For the last few years my brother, cousin, and I have been coming to eastern Washington to trout fish some the many lakes found in the Moses Lake to Ephrata area. Over the last few years we have been almost exclusively fishing Dry Falls Lake. This year trout fishing was a little slow. We arrived on Saturday afternoon. On Sunday and Monday, the three of us landed only two trout in total. On Tuesday a front moved through the area which brought with it winds (20 to 30 mph sustained with gust to 40 mph) which eliminated

any fishing. After the front passed fishing picked up on Wednesday and Thursday.


Dry Falls Lake has been stocked with rainbow trout and brown trout. The number rainbow trout significantly out numbers browns, but trout in the lake are good condition. I caught just two rainbows this year but both were 21 inches and probably weighed four to five pounds.

On Friday my cousin and I drove south to the Quincey Wildlife Area and fished Quincey Lake. Water temperatures were warmer and fish more active. We hooked two dozen trout but only landed 9. Most ranged from 15 to 18 inches with a few 12 to 14 inches. I also got to fish my first callibaetis hatch on a lake. I was able to cast and retrieve hares ear nymphs on an intermediate line and hooking 9 but only landed 3 trout.




