WEISER COMMUNITY POND - 2020

It has been over 10 years since Weiser Community Pond opened for fishing. In those 10 yrs. Indianhead Fly Fishers membership has changed. I thought that a small history and some "tidbits" of its development may be of interest.

The idea of a place for kids to fish around Weiser was discussed in our membership meetings around the spring and fall 2007. Mark Sands and I were looking for such a place long before and got serious about finding a place for the pond. Our first meeting to discuss how we might proceed was held Jan 9, 08, with a group called "Bridge to Bridge" to discuss grants to fund the project. Also in attendance was Mayor Walker (deceased) and City Clerk Dave Tate, members of Weiser Feed and Storage (eventually donators of the property for the pond), representative of Rail to Trail, Ducks Unlimited, RC&D and at least 7 members of Indianhead Fly Fishers including president Perry Kelley and vice president Jim Gulu and State Representative Diana Thomas. Monthly meetings followed and on March 31, 2008 Mark introduced regional director IDFG, Jeff Dillion (eventually wrote the grant application for funding). In that March meeting Ken Gissel (Payette County Commissioner and IHFF) joined our pond group.

After many meetings and a lot of work by Jeff we received word on June 4, 2009 the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service announced Federal funding would come under the authority of the Dingell-Johnson Sport Fish Restoration Act. The grant was for \$90,682. On June 18, 2009 an invitation to bid on construction of pond was offered. Nine (9) bids were received ranging from \$55885.95 to \$107939. Warner Construction, Boise, was awarded the contract as the lowest bid. They started construction on Aug. 10, 2009. The City of Weiser employees constructed the access area to the pond by clearing trees and private "stuff" in the right of way to the pond. The WEISER COMMUNITY POND was official opened Oct 17, 2009.

During this planning and construction of the pond IHFF membership grew close to 60 active members. Probably the largest active group in Weiser. The Weiser Chamber of Commerce awarded the Indianhead Fly Fishers the Non Profit Organization of the year for 2009 for its involvement in the development of the "new community resource".

The Elks were awarded a grant from their National Assoc. for handicap access and a fishing dock. Many others got involved in helping either through donation of money or time to create the pond as it is today. IHFF members also obtained additional grants from State Parks and Recreation and at least 2 special grants from the R.K.Mellon Family Foundation. This money was spent on walking paths, aeration equipment, trash cans etc. The last of the Federal money,(\$14000) was spent on the vaulted toilet. The City of Weiser has installed lighting, fencing, Billy Creek, access to the Weiser River and lots of time maintaining the grounds around the pond.

The monthly meetings have ended and now we have a meeting or two a year and the Pond committee is composed of members





from: the City, the Elks, the old Weiser Feed and Storage ,Idaho Fish and Game, and IHFF. maybe the Indianhead Fly Fishers may want to consider making it their "new project" to help the City of Weiser in

Ten years of use and some parts of the Weiser Community Pond need a bit of attention. The asphalt path needs attention, the aeration equipment may soon need replacements, and the chemicals needed to keep algae and cattail in check and kill weeds needs



replenished. All of these things I'm sure the City of Weiser will eventually budget for. But in the application for our Federal grant Jeff Dillion made reference to our obligation in a memorandum of understanding to help maintain this "pond" as Family Fishing Water. So financing and making the W e i s e r Community Pond even a b e t t e r community resource than it is.

If there is anything else you may want to know about W e i s e r

Community Pond just ask me and make sure you do soon before I forget or can't remember!

### <u>The Almighty Quill from</u> <u>Yesteryear</u>

When I first started my career angling with a fly (many years ago) I remember that there were several popular fly patterns that were identified by "Quill." Ginger Quill, Brown Quill and Catskill Quill were common fly patterns that were in most fly boxes.
At that time in my angling career I had no idea what a quill was other than a feather pen that was dipped into a container of ink to autograph famous documents.

Move ahead 70 years and I find out the significance of "quill" in the art of fly tying. A quill, as one might expect, is part of a feather used to replicate the segmented abdomen of an insect. To tie, shape the abdomen with flat tying thread. Either use the rotary feature of your tying vise or wrap several times and allow thread to untwist. Count wraps and then count rotations when untwisting. From the back, wrap quill using touching wraps. You may tie off the quill when you get to the thorax. Usually the thorax is tied with dubbing.

Several different feathers can be used to tie "Quill" patterns. I will cover several options, some contemporary and some traditional. Peacock eye feathers are a common source. The colors of the quill are brown with a narrow black edge. Peacock eyes are flat and sometimes without fuzz. Probably you will have to remove some of the fuzz to have enough length to complete the abdomen. To prepare peacock eyes, rub the fuzz from the feather with a pencil eraser. There are other ways to remove the hurl from peacock feathers using chemicals or household bleach.

Other common feathers that are common sources for quill are hackle feathers. Preparation of hackles is quite simple.



Simply remove all hackle fibers from the stem of the feather. It is suggested to soak the stem in water to make the quill pliable. Other methods to soften the quill is to put a drop of cooking oil in a package of quills. Without soaking or using oil, quills are somewhat fragile.

Although quill patterns are somewhat yesteryear patterns, they have some advantage especially for smaller dry fly

Do not try Crappie fishing with a standard trout fishing rig.....#5 weight rod, intermediate sinking line, and match the hatch fly. It just doesn't work that way for Crappie.

Jack and I fished Trail Creek inlet on Brownlee Reservoir twice in the past week, each time Scott from Eagle showed up with his little funky Crappie spinning rod equipped with two red head white jigs. He proceeded to catch fish after fish while Jack and I caught a scant two or three. Yesterday he caught over 50, maybe 75, possibly 100 while we caught zip.

I finally violated ethics rules and cuddled up as close as I dared, watching him fish, catch fish, and release all but the largest. I copied where he cast, how he retrieved his two fake jigs. I just didn't catch and release another fish like him. I was catching NADA, NIENTE, NIEN, NYET, NOTHING!!!

In desperation I scrounged a lost bobber from the shore, mounted it along with the aforementioned fake red and white jigs, and WOW caught a Crappie, and then another, and another!!

The educational opportunity was that when fishing for Crappie, use a funky little Crappie rig, with fake plastic red and white jigs not an overweighted heavy sinking line trout rig where you cannot feel the bite.

I was addicted to the L was addicted to the but I turned Hokey pokey, but I turned Hokey myself around.
